8. Travel:

- a) By Air: there are a number of international airports within 1 hours travel of Sheffield:

Manchester is the biggest and is served by major airlines plus some budget airlines. There is a direct train to Sheffield from the airport. Distance from Sheffield = 50 miles. See www.manchesterairport.co.uk/ for flight details and www.nationalrail.co.uk/times_fares/ for train timetables

East-Midlands is served by various budget airlines. Either rent a car or take the bus (coach) to Sheffield. Distance from Sheffield = 35 miles. See <http://www.eastmidlandsairport.com/emaweb.nsf/Content/Destinations> for flight details.

Leeds-Bradford is served by various budget airlines. Either rent a car or take the bus (coach) to Leeds and then take the train to Sheffield. Distance from Sheffield = 55 miles. See <http://www.leedsbradfordairport.co.uk/flightsandholidays-allflights.php> for flight details

Doncaster (also called Robin-Hood Airport) is served by some budget airlines. Either rent a car or take the bus (coach) to Doncaster



Interchange and then another bus or train to Sheffield. Distance from Sheffield = 15 miles. See <http://www.robinhoodairport.com/flight-information.html> for flight details.

It is possible to fly to the various London Airports (Heathrow, Gatwick, Stanstead or Luton) and then either drive, take the bus (coach) or train to Sheffield. Distance from the London airports is between 150 and 200 miles but this can take 4 hours or more by road

- b) By Road: Sheffield is situated approximately 10 miles off the M1 motorway
- c) By Rail. Sheffield is connected directly with London, Manchester, Birmingham etc.

Once you are in Sheffield it is easy to get around by bus. Millhouses park is served by the [number 97 or 98](#) and these buses also within 200m of The Climbing Works (ask the bus driver to tell you when you are the Woodseats Road stop) and the number [75](#) (the one from Jordanthorpe to Ecclesfield) or [76](#) (the one from Low Edges to High Green) stop virtually outside The Climbing Works (ask the bus driver to tell you when you are the first stop at the bottom of Woodseats Road).

There are a number of hotels within easy reach of the venue.
